Description:

<u>Didactic sessions</u> provide an overview of concepts dealing with the prevention of disease from the clinical perspective. This includes epidemiology, etiology, screening techniques and therapeutic approaches to mitigate morbidity associated with diseases both acute and chronic. This will be carried out by lecture and expert guest presentations supported by computer simulated case scenarios and small group discussion. The course will use *Public Health and Preventive Medicine* Maxcy-Rosenau-Last (M/R/L 2007) as a core reference, supplemented with additional guided reading.

<u>Journal Club</u> will develop student's ability to critically evaluate and apply the published literature to a population/community health concern. Students are introduced to methods for defining a clinical preventive question in terms of – the <u>population health issue</u>, <u>intervention</u>, <u>comparison</u> and <u>outcomes</u>, refining a literature search strategy using a revised PICO and Search Strategy and Come prepared to provide a synopsis of your question, search strategy and the results of your literature search (types and critical appraisal of the articles identified.

Course Objectives:

At completion of this course, students should be able to

- 1. Apply methods for evaluating and presenting the evidence-based literature in Clinical Preventive Medicine.
- 2. Critically evaluate programmatic and practice-based issues in Clinical Preventive Medicine.
- 3. Compare and contrast population-based versus patient-based clinical and preventive medicine.

Student Evaluation:

This course is offered as Credit/No Credit only. To earn course Credit, students must successfully meet the following expectations:

- 1) Class Participation reflecting command of main themes from readings, through class discussion and/or acquisition/sharing of materials in class
- 2) Journal Club Presentation and Participation. Regularly present and actively participate in Journal club evidence-based presentation of a clinical preventive services issue.
- 3) Examination—consisting of multiple choice and short answer questions to assess learning.
